- They might not have access to enough barley and beans to make it part of their main diet or it might not grow as well as wheat.






Conclusion


the number of people grew, and so did their problems

- 3. The people of Sumer can go back to hunting animals and gathering nuts, berries, fruits.. etc




Problem 3:International Divisions


Pros

It will protect civilians from famine.


- Lets them have more resources and lets them move out of the area that doesn't have enough resources for them to live on.

Pros


- It allows Ibbi-Sin to create new rules and regulations that he believes are better and stronger for the community.
